Plano pa itong sundan ng panukalang batas kung saan **obligahin ang lahat ng social media user sa ID verification at Facial recognition.**

Sinisikap ng mga mambabatas na itulak ang social media registration sa iba't ibang dahilan: para diumanong labanan ang disinformation (Digital Accountability and Services Act) at para protektahan ang mga menor de edad (Act Regulating the Use of Social Media Platforms by Minors).

Hindi lamang nito tatanggalin ang karapatan sa anonymity sa Internet, padadaliin ng Social Media Registration ang pagtarget ng estado sa mga kumukontra at lumalaban sa kurapsyon at mga patakarang mapang-abuso.

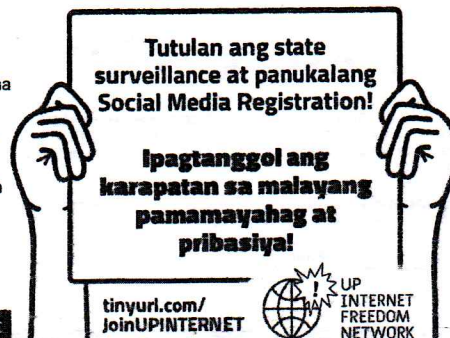
Tama lamang ang magalit.

Under a corrupt system...

It is the administration's greatest interest to instill fear in its constituents and deprive us of a space for free speech. This is precisely why laws and policies that violate our privacy are being proposed and implemented left and right.

The **SIM Registration Act** that Marcos Jr. prioritized did not only fall short on its promise to curb scams and cybercrimes. It is deliberately being used as an instrument to attack activists and critics. On top of that, lawmakers are pushing to require ID verification and possibly facial recognition for all new and existing social media users in the country through **Social Media Registration**.

Currently, legislators are seeking to push for social media registration for different reasons: to allegedly address disinformation (Digital Accountability and Services Act) and to protect minors (Act Regulating the Use of Social Media Platforms by Minors).

Social Media Registration does not only remove our right to anonymity and free speech on the Internet. It makes any user an easy target of the state, especially those who oppose corruption and exploitative policies.

Our anger is justified.

While ordinary citizens experience preventable flooding time and time again, corrupt members of congress, the senate, and their cronies continue to bask in their ill-gotten wealth. It is no surprise that the Filipino people are taking a stand both online and on the streets.

We must resist these anti-privacy policies and stand firm against corruption and abuse.
